

Tank Troopers

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Please read this manual carefully before using this software. If the software is to be used by young children, the manual should be read and explained to them by an adult.

- ◆ Unless stated otherwise, any references to "Nintendo 3DS" in this manual apply to all systems in the Nintendo 3DS™ family.
- ◆ When playing on a Nintendo 2DS™ system, features which require closing the Nintendo 3DS system can be simulated by using the sleep switch.

IMPORTANT

Important information about your health and safety is available in the Health and Safety Information application on the HOME Menu. You should also thoroughly read the Operations Manual, especially the "Health and Safety Information" section, before using Nintendo 3DS software.

Language Selection

The in-game language depends on the one that is set on the system. This title supports six different languages: English, German, French, Spanish, Italian and Dutch.

If your Nintendo 3DS system language is set to one of these, the same language will be displayed in the software. If your Nintendo 3DS system is set to another language, the in-game default language will be English.

For instructions about how to change the system language, please refer to the System Settings electronic manual.

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After the Nintendo 3DS system or any software is updated, any existing or future unauthorised technical modification of the hardware or software of your Nintendo 3DS system, or the use of any unauthorised device in connection with your Nintendo 3DS system, may render your Nintendo 3DS system permanently unplayable. 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
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2 Setting Up Your Tank

You can choose your tank and troopers when you visit the garage. In the garage, press  (or touch  / ) to switch between tanks. You will be able to gain access to more tanks by playing the game and using the funds you acquire to get them. Choose your troopers and your tank design, and when you're ready to roll out, select "Ready to Go"!



1 The tank

Move  to adjust the camera's position, and press  /  to zoom in and out.

2 The tank's name

3 Funds (in G)

4 Your current tank

5 The tank's price (in G)

6 Spots for troopers

7 The tank's stats

Attack	This stat affects the damage your tank is capable of dealing.
Reload	The amount of time it takes to load a new shell (in seconds).
Speed	The tank's maximum speed.

Defense	This stat affects damage received. Compared to the front, a tank's defense is somewhat weaker on the sides and back.
Range	The distance a shell can travel when shot in a straight line.
Rotation	The amount of time it takes for a tank to turn 90 degrees (in seconds).

Troopers




1 Info about the currently selected trooper

2 Available spots for troopers

The number of troopers that can crew the currently selected tank is indicated by the number of slots here.

3 Roster of troopers


Choose the troopers you'd like to add to your tank's crew.

◆ Select  to have troopers get out of your tank.

Paint Job

On this screen, you can change the way your tank looks.



◆ Select  to return your tank to its default appearance.

3 Piloting Your Tank

Tank Controls

Aiming with Motion Controls

If you tilt your system while in battle, the in-game view will tilt to match.

When using this software, you may have to move the Nintendo 3DS system around. Make sure you have enough room before playing, and hold the system firmly with both hands. Do not move the system with excessive force, as this could lead to injuries, damage to the product or damage to nearby objects.

The Battle Screen

Some elements of the battle screen differ in the single player and multiplayer modes.



1 Time remaining

If time runs out, the battle ends.

2 Tank's armor gauge

If no energy remains in this gauge, your tank is destroyed.

3 Reload gauge

Once this gauge fills, press **R** to fire a shell. Once you fire a shell, the meter will immediately empty and then begin to fill again.

4 Map

This displays information about the entire field of battle. Press **Y** to switch to the radar.

5 Troopers in your crew

To summon a trooper and use his or her special ability, touch their portrait. Special abilities consume stamina. Stamina will slowly replenish only while a trooper is inside the tank.

6 Aim assist

Touch this icon to turn aiming assistance on or off. When it is set to on, your tank's aim will automatically adjust to help you hit your target.

7 Reset motion controls

Touch this to reset the motion sensor and recenter the camera.



Saving Data


The game will automatically save your progress when you do things like finish a mission, change tanks, or change game settings.



Deleting Data

You can delete your saved data by selecting "Delete Save Data" in the Settings menu.

◆ **Be careful! If you delete your saved data, there is no way to recover it.**

- Do not repeatedly reset the system or intentionally input incorrect controls. Do not remove any Game Card/SD card inserted into the system while saving. Make sure not to get dirt in the terminals. These actions could result in permanent data loss.
 - Do not use external accessories or software to modify your save data, as this can lead to an inability to progress or loss of save data. Any modification is permanent, so be careful.

5 Multiplayer

Choose "Mode Selection" and then "Multiplayer" to play with up to five other friends via local wireless.

Systems in the Nintendo 3DS family:
One per player (up to six)
Software downloads: One per player

How to Start Local Play

The host will search for other players. Once the other players join, the battle can begin!

Recruiting Players

1. Select "Create a Room", then choose the rules for battle, the map, and set the time limit.
2. Choose your tank and troopers and then select "Ready".
3. Once all participants have selected "Ready", the match will start.

Joining a Room

Select "Join a Room", then choose "Find a Room" or "Search by Code". Once you've chosen your team, tank, and troopers, select "Ready".

Single Player

If you choose "Mode Selection" and then "Single Player", you can choose a play mode and set out for battle.



Take Orders

Take on missions with a predetermined loadout of tank and troopers.



Custom Tank

Choose your own tank and troopers, and take on missions.



If one player has downloaded this game, and each player has their own system in the Nintendo 3DS family, they can send data to up to five other players to play together in local battles.

- ◆ In Download Play battles, all players will use the same tank and troopers.

Getting started with Download Play

In Download Play, the player with the full download version of the game will search for other players. Once the other players join the game, the battle will begin.

Creating a Room

1. Choose "Mode Selection" and then "Download Play".
2. Once all participating players have joined, select "Continue".
3. Set the battle rules, time, and teams, and then select "Ready".
4. Once all participants have selected "Ready" the match will start.

Joining a Room

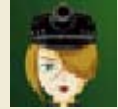
1. Select the Download Play icon from the HOME Menu, and choose "Open".
 2. Select the Nintendo 3DS logo.
 3. Choose this software.
- ◆ You may need to perform a system update. Follow the on-screen instructions to begin the update.
If you receive a message during

the system update that the connection was unsuccessful, carry out the system update from the System Settings application.

4. Choose the team you'd like to join, and select "Ready".

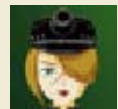


Q: What can you tell me about troopers?



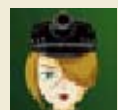
A: Troopers are elite crew members that ride in your tank during missions. Each has a different special ability! Be sure to bring along as many as you can. It's no exaggeration to say that recruiting troopers is more important than acquiring new tanks!

Q: What kind of tank should I use?



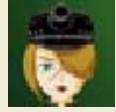
A: The higher the tank's specifications, the more expensive it will be. However, a smart commander who knows how to best utilize the troopers and their abilities can hold their own against top-tier opponents using a basic tank!

Q: How do a tank's stats affect things?



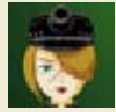
A: Aside from the stats displayed in the garage (p. 2), there are also other differences, like barrel angle and troopers' stamina recovery. By the way, tanks with fewer spots for troopers generally recover stamina faster!

Q: Can you give me tips for winning battles?



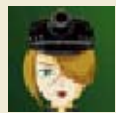
A: First, figure out if your tank is meant for long- or short-range combat, then choose the troopers best suited to that style. You'll be well on the way to victory!

Q: I'm stuck. Any tips for clearing missions?



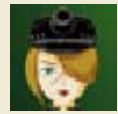
A: Play Custom Tank mode and get a tank that's well suited to facing the challenge! You can't customize your tank setup in Take Orders mode, so certain missions might be more difficult to clear. In general, you need to get the basics of piloting a tank right before you can hope to win.

Q: I'm out of funds! Can you give me some advice on earning coins?



A: You can get coins not only by defeating enemies, but also by destroying boulders, buildings, metal drums, and more! You'll also get more coins while battling in multiplayer... so battle, battle, and battle some more!

Q: Why doesn't artillery mode work?



A: Certain tanks don't support artillery mode (the Rice Ball, for example). However, to make up for this, those tanks have high core stats!
